


What To Do In Bad Weather



Weather conditions can become dangerous quickly!

1 HAVE YOUR PHONE ON, RINGER ON, AND PLEASE PAY ATTENTION TO IT

We are constantly watching the weather and checking in with sources in nearby towns to decide if we need to pull you off the water. If it's just a little shower coming through, we let you stay on the water, but high winds and lightning are a very dangerous situation.

2 IF THE WEATHER HAS CHANGED AND WE HAVE NOT DIRECTED YOU WHERE TO GO

DRIVE INTO THE WIND!

Your first reaction may be to outrun the storm like you might in a car. The problem is, you run out of lake. You may then find yourself on the roughest water in the highest winds and... in trouble. In this situation, ALWAYS steer into the direction the wind is coming from. This should take you to the calmest water and a place of safety.

3 BEACHING THE BOAT

When you reach calm waters there may not be any place to tie up. Don't worry. Raise your motor up (but not too much) keep the prop in the water and nudge the boat up on shore. Turn the engine off, let everyone get off, then use the anchor rope to tie off to anything sturdy you can find.
